
Vasily Lukyanov, aka <u>Silvavasil LEGO</u>




Joe Perez, aka <u>MortalSwordsman</u>


### Chi Hsin-wei, aka <u>LEGO 7</u>






Felix Jaensch, aka <u>AnActionfigure</u>



#### Mount Rushmore National Monument








#### Akihiro Soma, aka umamen
